STUDY GUIDE FOR THE MUSIC HISTORY DIAGNOSTIC EXAM FOR INCOMING GRADUATE STUDENTS

The Music History Diagnostic Exam for incoming graduate students is designed to assess the current level of understanding possessed by the student. Areas of weakness revealed by the test may result in required additional courses in music literature, above those required for the degree. The exam consists of matching, short answer, identification of works, composers and periods, as well as a short essay on a given topic. The exam is offered the Saturday before the semester commences, in both fall and spring (more information can be found on the Graduate Timeline https://www.jsu.edu/music/graduate/index.html). The exam must be taken before the student accomplishes more than nine credits of coursework, though it is recommended it be done the first semester.
