

Introducing LTC Travis J. Easterling: New Gamecock Battalion PMS

With no banquet this year, we were unable to officially introduce the new Gamecock Battalion Professor of Military Science, LTC Travis J. Easterling. LTC Easterling is a native of Harrisburg, Arkansas. He commissioned as an Aviation Officer in May 2004 through U.S. Army's Reserve Officer Training Corps at Arkansas State University, LTC Easterling continued his education by receiving his Master's in Leadership and Management from Webster University in St. Louis, MO and graduating from the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, KS.



After graduating Flight School at Fort Rucker, Alabama, LTC Easterling was assigned to the 12th Combat Aviation Brigade in Katterbach, Germany.

While stationed in Germany, he deployed, as a Platoon Leader, to both Afghanistan and Iraq. After graduating the Aviation Captain's Career Course, he was assigned to the 16th Combat Aviation Brigade in Fairbanks, Alaska where he commanded two separate companies. LTC Easterling deployed, as a company commander, to Pakistan and Afghanistan. LTC Easterling served as an Observer Controller and Trainer at the Joint Readiness Training Center at Fort Polk, Louisiana after company command. After graduating the Command and General Staff Course, LTC Easterling moved to Fort Drum, New York and was assigned as the Operations Officer for 1-89 Cavalry Regiment and deployed to Afghanistan. After redeploying, LTC Easterling was reassigned to 3-10 General Support Aviation Battalion where he served as the Executive Officer and deployed to Operation Atlantic Resolve. Prior to selection as Professor of Military Science at Jacksonville State University, he served as Board President for the United States Army Combat Readiness Center in Fort Rucker, Alabama. He conducted over 12 major accident investigations while assigned to United States Combat Readiness Center.

LTC Easterling's awards and decorations include the Bronze Star (1 Oak Leaf Cluster), Meritorious Service Medal (2 Oak Leaf Cluster), Air Medal, Joint Service Commendation Medal, Army Commendation Medal (2 Oak Leaf Cluster), Army Achievement Medal, Meritorious Unit Citation, Army Superior Unit Award, Humanitarian Service Medal, and the Senior Aviator Badge. LTC Easterling and his wife Jessica have been married for over 16 years and have two girls Emma (13) and Gracie (11).

In addition to LTC Easterling, we also missed the opportunity to recognize the excellent Gamecock Battalion cadre: MAJ Nicholas Kolodziey, MSG Randy Serna, SFC Michael Parker, Mr. Eric Sloughfy, and Mr. Austin Bragg. Military Alumni of the Year Nominations
